### **Parliament House Sydney**

A delegation from Dungog presented to interested parties at Parliament House, Sydney, a talk entitled "Tillegra Dam Environment & Financial Folly or Water Necessity". The presentation was well received & the travellers certainly enjoyed their trip.



#### **Stateline ABC Television**

Nick Grimm from Stateline visited the Williams River & Valley & filmed a segment which was presented by Quentin Dempster on Stateline on Friday night (26/09/08). Mother Nature was with us in spirit on the day with a platypus & a freshwater crayfish both appearing for the cameras, as if on cue. The segment featured the beautiful Williams River & focused on what will be lost if the proposed dam goes ahead. For those that missed it a transcript is available on the ABC website.



#### **Public Awareness**

The public are slowly becoming aware that it will be them that will bear the cost of the proposed dam, not only environmentally but also financially. Hunter Water is proposing to charge residential customers an extra \$322 over 4 years for water & sewerage. The increase would in part pay for capital infrastructure, including the dam, the cost of which is now estimated at \$406 million. The corporation estimates that a typical family would contribute about \$38 a year towards the Tillegra project. What average household can afford this? There has been a lot of publicity in this area of late—something we have been trying to bring to the forefront for a long time. We need to keep this public awareness going, especially when the financial woes of the State are currently in the press. The need to spend money on more vital areas such as health, transport and education is an issue that continually needs to be pressed. The fact that Tillegra Dam is an unnecessary, very costly white elephant, is being exposed by NTDG with the assistance of John Kaye, Greens MP, & Leigh Martin, Total Environmental Centre, with independent inquiries being called for.

#### **Membership**

Membership fees are due for renewal. These fees help cover the expense of the continuing administration costs incurred by our group. Many members are giving their time again & again, as well as paying out of pocket expenses, to assist in bringing unnecessary proposal to an end.
